

Weobley High School Religious Education Marking Policy

Aim

Teacher feedback encourages students to take ownership of their work and targets. This is supported by regular checking of students work books and brief formative comments by teachers.

Marking work

Students who complete work on computers:

Will need a “**Marking Feedback**” **exercise book** where the teacher can write comments /use the marking sheets provided or print of the user report from the RE VLE.

Students who complete the **majority of their work in exercise books:**

Teacher feedback and comments (Use provided sheets if you would like)

Students must respond to the feedback in their “Exercise Books” with:

WWW (What went well) and EBI (Even Better If) – Suggestion of at least two points for each

Student work should be checked on a regular basis –It is essential that students engage with this marking; teachers need to build in time for students to respond to feedback and make corrections.

Students are to self or peer-assess work, teacher must also ensure that students are responding to these teacher comments.

Students must respond to the feedback in their “Marking Book” with:

WWW (What went well) and EBI (Even Better If) – Suggestion of at least two points for each

Group Frequency

KS3: Once every 4-5 weeks for feedback.

Use the sheets if preferred (see below) and if appropriate highlight whether:

E: Emerging; **D:** Developing; **S:** Secure; **Ex:** Extended; **Exc:** Excellence

KS4: Every 4-5 weeks for feedback. Sheets if preferred OR use the VLE User report grade that can be printed and placed in marking books:

E: Excellent; **G:** Good; **S:** Satisfactory; **P:** Poor

Assessments

At **KS3** all students will cover a complete a formal assessment. Grades will take the format of: Emerging; Developing; Secure; Extended; Excellence.

At **KS4** all students will undergo regular formal assessment through the use of past paper questions;

All test data is stored centrally on a database for monitoring by the class teacher and emailed to the subject leader.

Marking codes to be used where appropriate:

Marking for literacy:

Sp = write sp by the word or in the paragraph. You may wish to write the correct spelling or ask the students to find the word and its correct spelling. Students write them in the back of their book. The maximum number of words per marking session will depend on the unit being covered.

Gr = grammar error.

“double-tick” = good writing

? = unclear writing, student needs to check. Give them an opportunity to rewrite the next lesson.

^ = missing word

// = new paragraph needed, encourage students to use paragraphs when they are writing.

UL = Underline heading

F = Full sentences/full answer required

C = Capital letters
